



Your membership also matters in another important way. The more official members we have in our rolls, the stronger our voice is within the city. Currently we represent about one-third of our residents and that is a solid number for this type of organization. But we need more!

We live in a political environment that is extremely challenging. It is imperative we stay engaged and involved. The city looks to the NIA as the residents’ representative. Nothing would make our positions stronger than to say we no longer represent one-third of residents, we represent one-half. Wow! That gets people listening.

NEWLY APPROVED BY-LAWS DEFINE MEMBERSHIP

At the November 2024 General Membership meeting a revised set of by-laws was approved. The revised by-laws helped clarify what had been, to date, undefined and somewhat nebulous issues.

The definition of membership in the NIA was not clearly defined until now. It may differ from what you have understood membership to be in the past so please take your time and read the actual revised by-laws on the naplesislands.org website.

In a nutshell, a membership is defined by a single individual paying dues. So, in a household with two adults and one dues payment, only one of the household is the member, with member rights. One household member would be the Primary member and the other adult becomes the secondary member. The Primary member has voting rights at general meetings and can hold a board position. The secondary adult cannot, but can still participate on committees and as a committee chair. In the case of the Primary member unavailable to attend a General Membership meeting the Secondary member may vote in their place (serve as their proxy). But only one vote for that household.


For instance, in my household, we pay our dues. That allows the one adult designated on the membership form as Primary with the right to vote or to hold office. Since I am on the board, I will need to be the primary member. My husband will be listed as secondary and has no voting rights and cannot hold office. In the event that I am not available to attend a general meeting to vote; he is able to vote in my place. Again, only if I do not attend. So, you may consider this to mean one vote per household.

In the case of a household where both adult members want the right of membership, then each individual pays dues. Adult A and Adult B both pay dues. They have separate membership forms and each would list themselves as the Primary member.

There have been concerns about how to do this and retain a certain level of membership benefits without each individual needing to give substantially more than they did in the past. I do have a workaround for that, so if that is your situation, please reach out to me at cindybambam@verizon.net.

Lastly, as a Primary member, you must be in Good Standing (up to date on financial obligations, dues) and a member for at least 30 days in order to vote.

While this may seem complicated, it is in line with many organizations' definition of membership and clears up confusion as to who has a right to vote.

I walked down 2nd after the storm and there was just the smallest of debris on the sidewalk. I would have hated to see what the outcome would have been without that trimming happening when it did.



We also had enough money to give our very tired Toy Soldier holiday bridge decorations a total makeover. They have stood guard on our bridges for 50 years. They cost a total of \$3,000 for 26 soldiers.



There are other maintenance and clean-up issues we can address with your bumping it. Power washing the canal sidewalks after all the hot cocoa is spilled? Some extra weeding and clean up around bridges and canal stairs? Painting bridge railing? Some prettifying around the big missing chunks of the seawall on the land side (maybe considered lipstick on a pig)?

Nothing is planned—as we don't know if the funds will come in, but with your “bumping it”, we can raise those extra dollars and take care of some things that will make our community shine a little brighter.






There's a new kid in town and a new partnership between our LB CERT - Naples Island Team and the Scout's Long Beach Sea Base. Jeb Price (left), the new Sea Base Director, has a vision for more closely connecting the program with the community. One of his first efforts was to ask the Naples CERT program how they could support us. The response he got was quick and clear – "provide us with a secured spot to keep a trailer full of emergency supplies." After clearing it with the Long Beach Scout Council, Jeb came back with an enthusiastic "Yes!"

This project has been in the works for years, stymied only by the lack of a proper parking spot. Last year LB CERT repurposed a trailer for our use and committed to providing supplies from existing resources. With the Scout's green light, Long Beach CERT immediately created an action plan to stock and reposition the trailer to the Sea Base. A team of Naples CERT volunteers led by Rainer Rahaeuser (below left) is working with LB CERT to sort and organize the inventory. We couldn't be more excited to partner with the Scouts on this initiative. We will soon have critical medical and emergency supplies on our island to take care of residents and visitors if a major disaster strikes. Stay tuned for updates!

Go Naples! Fighting Crime from the Comfort of Your Own Phone

You've probably heard of the Broken Window Theory, the idea that keeping neighborhoods clean and well-maintained helps reduce crime. While we don't see many actual broken windows on the island, we do see things like graffiti, trash, and maintenance issues. The good news? You only have to lift a single finger (no, not that one, the index finger) to get those things cleaned up.

Step One:

Download the GoLongBeach app. It's also accessible online, but it's easier on mobile. Allowing it to use your location will help you report faster.

Step Two:

Select the problem.

Step Three:

Describe the problem if necessary if it's in an odd place or not immediately obvious - "it's on the back side of the utility box, facing away from the street."

Step Three and a Half:

Take a picture (of the problem, not your lunch). This should prepopulate the address for you (handy!)

Step Four:

Move the map to the exact location if necessary.

Step Five:

Select 'Request Anonymously' yes (if you are in the witness protection program) or no. You can put in an email if you want updates.

A minute or two and you have done your clean-up chores for the day. Easy!

WHAT CAN YOU GET FIXED WITH GOLONGBEACH?

- Graffiti on public property, like the annoying tagging on bridge railings and street signs. Graffiti on private property (businesses) will be sent to Code Enforcement and may take a bit longer.
- Scooters. Not while they're being ridden unfortunately. Just the ones dumped in your yard or in a big pile on your sidewalk.
- Potholes. Sorry, "repave my entire street" isn't an option quite yet.
- Streetlight out.
- The mattress your inconsiderate neighbor dumped in the alley while moving out (you can report the mattress, not the neighbor).

- Park sprinklers gone wild, and pipes that have given up.
- Weeds. Notice I said "weeds", not "weed". Different department.
- Trash in the park or on the beach. Again, not the scooter riders. Actual, physical litter.
- Flat animals. Not stingrays. The other, sadder kind, both pets and wild animals. This may take a few days.
- Fallen tree, broken tree limb, overgrown roots.
- Sidewalk vending.** Sigh. This will either go to the Health Department (sanitation issues) or the Business Licensing Department (noise, location, blocking the sidewalk issues). Good luck.

[**Vending issues in Naples? Never heard of it. Kidding! Naples Neighborhood Watch is actively working on the December vending issues. We'll keep you posted!]

OTHER STUFF...


- Shopping carts/belongings. You can report this, but the city may have to post it for 72 hours before the city collects it. "Stuff" left anywhere is legally considered abandoned property and private citizens like you have the right to dispose of it as you see fit at any time. Tip: wear gloves.
- Fireworks. Obviously you're not getting quick resolution on this, unless you actually watch the cartel deal go down and see the semi unloading into someone's garage. (Call 911 in that situation) The City Prosecutor will reach out here. Videos, addresses, license plates are ideal.
- Traffic Signal out - Call the non-emergency number for this one, so they can get on it asap if it's a busy street. 562-435-6711.

Other handy features: On the pulldown menu, you can see "All Requests". This will show things reported and current status.

Help keep Naples clean, shiny, and free of broken windows. GO report something!



ORCHID WISDOM with Cindy Murphy

In a quiet corner of Naples Island, Cindy Murphy tends more than twenty Cymbidium orchids—living links to a gift from her mother over fifty years ago. “They don’t like their feet wet,” Cindy laughs. Her orchids thrive in pots with a custom mix of soil, bark, and rocks for drainage. “As long as they drain well, they’re happy”—a philosophy that keeps them blooming year after year.

Blooming on Island Time

Cindy’s orchids flourish in Naples Islands’ salty air and marine-layer mornings, blooming as early as December and lasting into April. “These are the leftovers,” she says, pointing to a still-vibrant flower. “They’re tough.” They need sunlight, but too much shade stifles them. During rain, she covers them with plastic to keep roots from staying too wet.

Heirlooms in Bloom

Cindy re-pots when roots burst out or the pot becomes crowded. “Feeder bulbs (pseudobulbs) are key—they store water and feed new growth,” she says, you always keep those. She soaks roots

in diluted crystal fertilizer and adds a top-dressing every few weeks.

When her mother’s orchid won top honors at the Club’s Flower Show, Cindy felt a quiet kind of joy. Her orchids carry a legacy of care, from her mother’s hands to her own—and now, to neighbors learning from her garden.

CINDY’S ORCHID TIPS

- Fertilize every 2 weeks (diluted crystals)
Jan-July: high-nitrogen
Aug-Dec: low-nitrogen
- Repot after blooming—
when bulbs crowd pot
- Soak roots before repotting
- Soil: Dr. Earth + bark + rocks
- Sun + cool nights
- Rain? Use plastic sheeting
